NEW YORK CITY DEPARTMENT OF HEALTH & MENTAL HYGIENE

No. 1: **IN THE MATTER** of the intent to seek Franchise and Concession Review Committee approval pursuant to Section 1-16 of the Concession Rules of the City of New York, to utilize a different procedure, to enter into an amendment to the existing concession agreement with OptumRx Discount Card Services, LLC (formerly known as Catamaran Discount Card Services, LLC) to develop, operate and administer the NYC Drug Discount Card Program available to all New York City residents. The amendment will extend the expiration date of the concession agreement from January 1, 2022, to June 30, 2023.

The proposed franchise agreement has a term lasting from notice of commencement until June 26th, 2032. There is an option, at DoITT's sole discretion, for the Parties to extend the agreement for up to a further five-year period.

No. 6: **IN THE MATTER** of the intent to seek Franchise and Concession Review Committee approval of a proposed acquisition of ZenFi Networks, LLC, in its entirety, by BAI

US HoldCo LLC. ZenFi Networks, LLC is the holder of an information services franchise agreement with the City of New York which grants a nonexclusive franchise to construct, install, use, operate and/or maintain wire, cable, and/or optical fiber and associated equipment on, over, and under the inalienable property of the City for the provision of Information Services. The New York City Office of Technology and Innovation has reviewed the proposed transaction and the franchise agreement and has determined that FCRC approval is required.

NEW YORK CITY OFFICE OF TECHNOLOGY & INNOVATION

No. 7: **IN THE MATTER** of the intent to seek Franchise and Concession Review Committee approval of a proposed acquisition of ZenFi Networks, LLC by BAI US HoldCo LLC. ZenFi Networks, LLC is the holder of a mobile telecom franchise agreement with the City of New York allowing the installation, operation, maintenance of equipment and facilities, including base stations and access point facilities, on 1) City-owned street light poles and traffic light poles, and certain privately-owned utility poles located on the City streets, and 2) subject to necessary further approvals, LinkNYC kiosks, bus stop shelters, and automatic public toilets, all in connection with the provision of mobile telecommunications services. The New York City Office of Technology and Innovation has reviewed the proposed transaction and the franchise agreement and has determined that FCRC approval is required.
