New York City has officially opened its first shelter for transgender and gender-nonconforming people who are homeless. The facility will be located in Long Island City and will cost \$65 million to operate through 2030. Hailed as the

only city-funded shelter of its kind in the country, the shelter will support 150 150 transgender New Yorkers.

On Tuesday, July 29, the Senate Committee on Banking, Housing, and Urban Affairs unanimously passed the bipartisan “Renewing Opportunity in the American Dream (ROAD) to Housing Act”. This bill was endorsed NLIHC and includes provisions that will cover financial literacy, housing supply, manufactured housing, homeownership, program reform, veterans’ housing, and oversight and coordination of housing programs and agencies. This one is for all my pancake lovers out there. Summer is a great time for some of that griddle magic — anytime, really. I hope this list leaves you with the same comfort I get from a perfectly crisp and delicious flapjack.

Mark's Top 5:

1. [Clinton Street Baking Co.](#) - My favorite is the blueberry pancakes, but you can't go wrong with the others. Their maple butter...chef's kiss!
2. [Breakfast By Salt's Cure](#) - Love their "OG" Oatmeal Griddle Cake. A slightly different texture in typical pancakes. They're thin, soft, and crispy, but amazing nonetheless.
3. [Golden Diner](#) - Their Honey Butter Pancakes are so good. They're more cake-like, so bring a buddy. People line up for hours during brunch. But if you're like me and love pancakes at night also, visit for dinner and bypass the rush
4. [NAKS](#) - You ever had a salted egg pancake? I didn't think so. Well, their version with a hint of citrus is PHENomenal. Its uniqueness alone requires a visit.

5. [Frenchette](#) - The pancakes here are more pricy, but have the perfect crisp-to-fluffy ratio. It's soaked with syrup, reminding you of your childhood, and topped with salted butter; gold, Jerry, gold! Also, cake-like, so bring a date or find a family looking to share.

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
