New York City Department of Probation Holds Graduation Ceremony for Newest Probation Officer Recruits

NEW YORK – The New York City Department of Probation (DOP) today held a graduation ceremony to welcome its newest class of probation officer recruits. The event, held at the NYPD Police Academy Auditorium in Flushing, New York, marked the successful completion of a five-month rigorous training program designed to prepare the 37 graduates for the critical responsibilities of supervising individuals on probation, promoting public safety, and fostering rehabilitation.

The training includes the basic peace officer course as well as education on risk assessment, rehabilitation strategies, case management, firearms training, instruction on department policies and procedures, and field training. Probation officers play a vital role in balancing accountability with opportunity, ensuring that individuals under supervision are both held responsible for their actions and supported with the resources necessary to rebuild their lives.

"Public safety is the prerequisite to prosperity, and probation officers are essential to keeping our city safe while also creating opportunities for New Yorkers to turn their lives around," said **New York City Mayor Eric Adams**. "This new class of officers represents the best of public service — dedicated professionals who will hold individuals accountable while guiding them toward brighter futures. I congratulate today's graduates and thank them for answering the call to serve our city."

"Today's graduates represent the future of public safety and rehabilitation in New York City," said **DOP Commissioner Juanita N. Holmes**. "As probation officers, you are not only enforcing accountability but also offering pathways to second chances. The ceremony also featured remarks from Deputy Mayor of Public Safety Kaz Daughtry and Commissioner Holmes, who underscored the department's dedication to evidence-

Following the ceremony, the new probation officers will be deployed throughout New York City, joining the nearly 1,000 professionals at the Department of Probation who work daily to enhance public safety and support positive outcomes for the individuals they supervise.
